The grace of God can be received in vain (II Cor.6:1) All Christians are heirs of grace, under grace, received grace through Christ. Why then do so many remain babes and turn carnal. They received it in vain...They didn't use it, respond to it, exercise it.

Connect verse 9 with verse 10. Proof that Paul did not receive the grace of God in vain and testimony to its enabling power is this: Paul, the least and latest of all the apostles, because of the manitude of his sin not fit to be an apostle, laboured more abundantly than all the other apostles.

Paul is quick to add that all this labour was not him, but the gace of God. Paul is boasting, but boasting of the grace of God, not his own abilities and accomplishments.

Probably a more accurate interpretation of I Cor. 15:10 is this: The grace of God was not vain. It doesn't say that Paul's receiving it was not in vain. The grace of God CAN be received in vain (II Cor. 6:1). But this is not what Paul is saying here. He is saying that the grace of God he received was not an empty thing, devoid of any content. On the contrary it enabled him to labour more abundantly than all the other APREXXX Apostles...for all he did was really the grace of God doing it.

I am what I am by the grace of God I accomplished what I did by the grace of God.

The grace of God not only transform the character, it enables and energizes for service.

Daul is writing years after conversion, a mature, spiritual man. By the grace of God I am what I am doesn't simply refer to the initial act of salvation. How did he become such a holy man, a great Christian, faithful and fruitful servant, etc.? "BY THE GRACE OF GOD..."

To you who long to grow, mature, etc. Here is the secret... "By the Grace of God."

GRACE is one of those Biblical words we dwarfed, one demix dimensional view. If you think it refers only to the loving activity of God that gave His only Son to die for our sins... that initial act of salvation, you have an emaciated view of grace. I Peter 4:10 speaks of the MANIFOLD grace of God, the various kinds of grace.

Two things, then, are essential. We must profit by the grace we receive, and we must receive MORE grace. II Peter 1, as a prelude to the exhortation to grow, says, "May grace and peace be multiplied..." In James 4 and I Peter 5 we are told that God gives more grace to some while opposing others.
