FINDING WHERE WE ARE IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

(An Appraisal of our Spiritual Condition)

The first question God asked man was, "Where art thou?" It's still a good question. If a map is to help you reach a certain destination, you must first know your present position. And the first step in spiritual growth is an honest evaluation of your present spiritual position.

Scripture lesson: I Corinthians 2:11 through 3:4

In this passage are presented the Three Spiritual Positions:

- I. THE NATURAL MAN 2:14
 - 1. He is Bound to the Material. "Natural" is used of animal existence, that kind of life which has only physical and material needs.
- 2. He is Blind to the Spiritual "Receiveth not." Spiritual things are unwelcome in his life; he doesn't have the capacity to comprehend or understand spiritual matters.

II. THE CARNAL MAN 3:1-4

This is a Christian whose life is still dominated by the flesh, or the old fallen nature. The Holy Spirit dwells in him but does not dominate him.

- 1. Retarded Growth -- "babes" There is nothing wrong with being a baby, but it is abnormal to remain a baby.
 - Three stages to growth
- (1) Fed by others
- (2) Feed self
- (3) Feed others
- 2. Conduct similar to that of the lost. "walk as men."

If a lost person and a carnal Christian lived in the same home, you couldn't tell them apart.

- 3. Bad Disposition. 3:3
- 4. Unable to get along with others. 3:3

III. THE SPIRITUAL MAN 2:12, 13, 15, 16.

The difference between carnal Christian and the spiritual Christian is not in their possessions; they both possess the same. The difference is in their awareness and recognition of what they possess. In the spiritual Christian, the Holy Spirit not only dwells, but dominates.

- 1. Enlightened in the things of God. 2:12, 13 "that we may know."
- 2. Expresses the things of God. 2:13 "which things also we speak." What the Christian receives, he is to pass on to others. The carnal Christian doesn't do this, lacks the ability.
- 3. Evaluates all things. 2:15, 16
 He has the ability (given him by the Holy Spirit) to make right judgments; knows the difference between right and wrong.
 The spiritual principle is the basis of his judgment on the secular as well as the sacred.

STEPS TO BECOMING A SPIRITUAL CHRISTIAN: Recognize, admit:

- 1. Inadequacy of self -- a realistic view of self.

- 3. Indwelling of Holy Spirit. 3:16
