The story: Hosea married Gomer, who bore him three children -then Gomer played him false and she left him for a life of infidelity. After a while when she had descended to the uttermost depths of degradation, having become merely a slave, the property of some one else, Hosea sought her out in her destitution, brought her at half the price of a slave and restored her to his side as his bride. The first part of this story is tragic, but not uncommon. second part is by no means common, and is absolutely amazing. the first part we are familiar; it is tragic and heart-breaking, but not uncommon. But the story of the husband seeking his wife when she had fallen to this depth is very uncommon. It is all a picture of God and His people. The infidelity of Gomer interpreted to Hosea the infidelity of Israel. The Church is the bride of Christ. Hosea gives us God's conception of sin in the lives of his people. God's conception of sin in His people may be written in one phrase: unchastity in the marriage relation, just as men consider unfaithfulness on the part of a wife. The prophet insists that the relation of husband and wife, and so of God and His people shall be one of mutual love and faithfulness. Any violation of / the covenant relationship is unchastity.
