Let us = the prophet doesn't overlook himself

Search = lit. dig into, look for what is hidden from our eyes by our deceptive heart.

Try = explore, so as to become thoroughly acquainted w/ the object, so used of exploring a city or country.

Return = the proposition includes arrival at ones goal; not stop after one half or 9/10's of the way is completed.

Let us not be satisfied w/ lifting up our hands, w/ the uplifted hand let us lift up our hearts in sincere, repentant prayer.

Transgressed, ~~was~~ revolted, rebelled, were obstinate. The psalm describes the life of the nation as an uninterrupted obstinate rebellion.

Rest = the ultimate note
