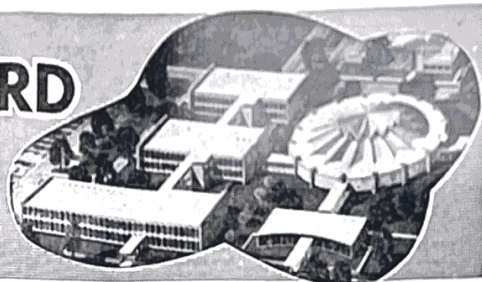

Dr. Hunter comes from England, and is the Field Representative in the work of Capernwray Missionary Fellowship, "The Torchbearers," a former principal of a state school and a war-time officer in the British Royal Air Force.

Dr. Hunter regularly speaks to youth and adult conferences in Great Britain, Germany and Scandinavia. He recently completed a thirty-three week speaking tour around the world including the Far East, Australia, New Zealand, India and Africa.

Dr. Hunter's ministry has been received enthusiastically in local churches, colleges and Bible Conferences, including Forest Home, Hume Lake, Mount Hermon, Cannon Beach and the Firs.

He has authored KNOWING GOD'S SECRETS, LIMITING GOD, LET US GO ON TO MATURITY and others.

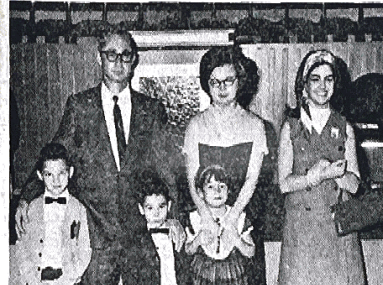

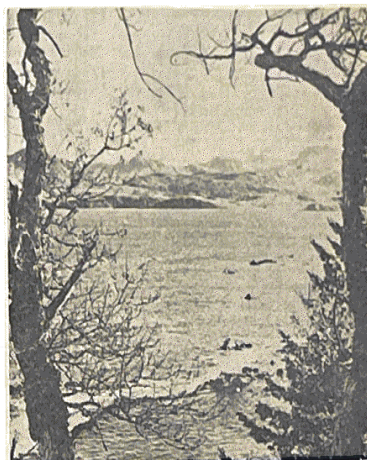
