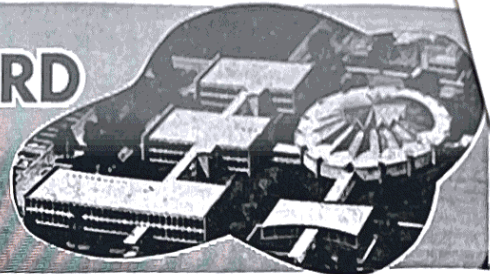

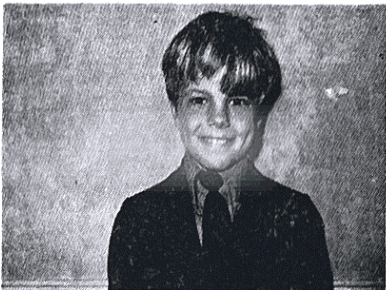
for MBCC's REVIVAL March 26-April 2 with EVANGELIST BOBBY BRITT from Birmingham, Ala. and MARION WARREN.

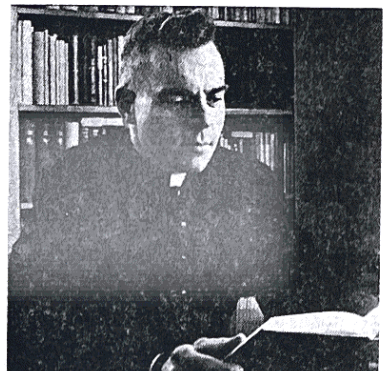

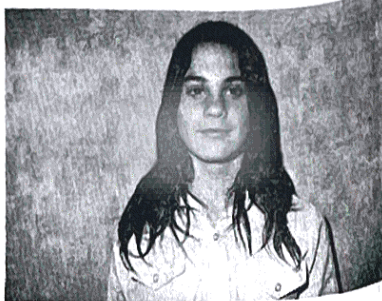

2. In three and one half months, the birth to 3 enrollment has increased from 136 to 157, and no immediate relief is in sight. As a matter of fact . . .

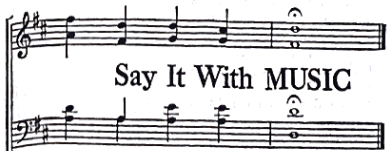
3. We must call upon our adults to help during the worship services. Better than that, just volunteer.

World Religious News Roundup

* LAYMAN ELECTED

ATLANTA — William A. Urch, a 31-year-old Kentucky layman has been unanimously elected to head the General Assembly's Committee on The Minister and His Work of the Presbyterian Church in the U.S.

* BAPTIST LEADER INAUGURATED

MONROVIA, Liberia — Dr. William R. Tolbert, Jr., a Baptist preacher and world Baptist leader, was formally inaugurated here as President of Liberia, succeeding the late President William Tubman, who died last July after 27 years in office.

* BISHOP CONDEMNNS PACT

SALISBURY — United Methodist Bishop Abel T. Muzorewa of Salisbury, speaking as chairman of the African National Congress of Rhodesia, denounced the terms of a proposed British-Rhodesian accord as a "sellout" of the country's blacks.

* CHURCH HOLDINGS REPORTED

MOSCOW — The Soviet people have been told that 11 major American church organizations profess to oppose the war in Indo-China but still profit from investments in companies making guns, missiles and bombers. A state radio network report gave some details from a study released by the Corporate Information Center of the National Council of Churches.

* FILES GIVEN LIBRARY

FORT WORTH — Extensive personal files of the late M. E. Dodd, president of the Southern Baptist Convention, 1933-35, have been contributed to the Treasure Room collection of Fleming Library at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary here.

* SALARIES FOR BLACKS UP

CAMBRIDGE — The Polaroid Corporation, which has been under fire for its operations in South Africa, has reported that the first year of its new program to improve the condition of its black South African workers has brought "practical achievements in salaries, benefits and education."
