MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. — James E. Beard, Minneapolis, has been named executive director of Project Equality of Minnesota, an interreligious action program sponsored by the Minnesota Council of Religion and Race.

#### \* AGENCIES ASK STUDY

ST. PAUL, Minn. — An interim committee should be established by the Minnesota Legislature to recommend the conversion from a war to a peace-time economy, a coalition of Minnesota's religious forces has proposed.
