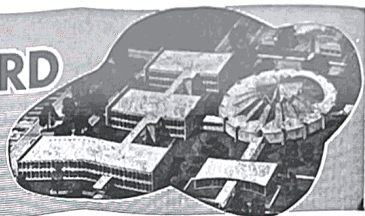

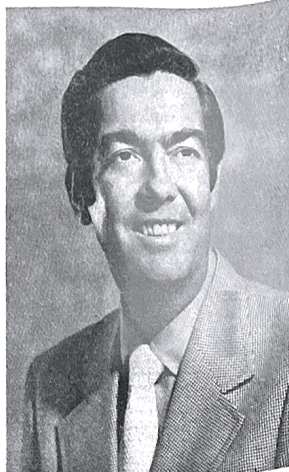

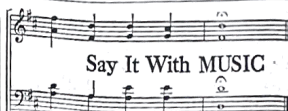

* DR. ARNOLD MICKELSON ELECTED

MINNEAPOLIS — Dr. Arnold R. Mickelson, secretary of the American Lutheran Church, has been elected president of the Lutheran Council in the U.S.A. (LCUSA), cooperative agency involving the three largest Lutheran bodies of the country.

* PRAYER TO OPEN MEETINGS

TORONTO — In a totally unexpected move, suburban North York's Council voted to return the Lord's Prayer to open its meetings. A month earlier the council voted to replace the prayer with a moment of silent meditation.

* DISCIPLES ALLOCATE \$50,000

INDIANAPOLIS — A grant of \$50,000 for reconstruction and development in Indo-China was the largest of allocations totaling \$102,000 approved here by the week of Compassion Committee of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).
