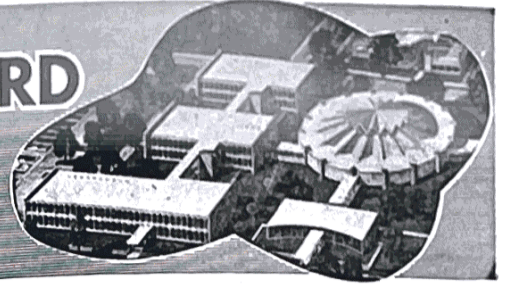

#### JUST WHAT WE NEEDED

Our REVIVAL is just one day old as of this writing, but it's already obvious that God is moving in our midst. As one member said to me after Sunday night's service, "I'm almost afraid of what God is going to do in my life this week."

BOBBY BRITTON'S messages last Sunday were EXACTLY what we needed. I couldn't have picked out two messages that would've better suited our need. Without a doubt God is speaking to us through His man. Are you listening? The one hopeless condition you can get yourself into is to say, "I have need of nothing."

If there isn't aroused within you a deep sense of need, then you ought to get off somewhere and ask God to break you and reveal to you your own sinfulness. It's only when we are looking away from Jesus that we get the idea we're OK.

Isaiah thought he had "ARRIVED" until he saw the Lord upon the throne, high and lifted up. Then he cried, "Woe is me! for I am undone."

My constant prayer this week is that we'll (myself most of all) SEE THE LORD UPON HIS THRONE, HIGH AND LIFTED UP. To get a glimpse of His holiness is all that is necessary to bring us to our knees in brokenness and contrition. And that, my friend, is REVIVAL!

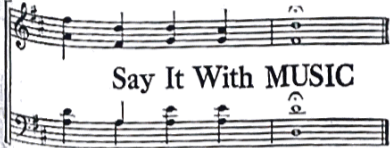

### World Religious News Roundup

#### \* UNION MOVE URGED

EDINBURGH — Representatives of the Church of Scotland (Presbyterian) and the Methodist Church in Scotland will ask their supreme courts to take steps toward a detailed plan of union later this year.

#### \* BOOK PUBLISHED BY SS BOARD

NASHVILLE — "Outreach with Church Buses," compiled by Reginald M. McDonough, has been published by Convention Press. The book is designed for churches that already have a bus ministry and for churches interested in starting a bus ministry.

#### \* UNITS TO MERGE

ALBUQUERQUE — Plans are proceeding here for the new single Synod of the Southwest of the United Presbyterian Church. The present Synod of New Mexico, meeting here, and the Synod of Arizona, meeting in Scottsdale, Ariz., agreed by telephone communication to merge in 1973.

The vote to merge the synods is subject to the approval of the denomination's General Assembly, which will meet in Denver in May.

#### \* MOVEMENT HAS LIMITED FUTURE

GREENVILLE, Ill. — Dr. Carl F. H. Henry, a noted evangelical Protestant theologian and author, asserted here that the "Jesus Movement" has "only a limited future" because it is "vulnerable to all varieties of excess and deviation."

#### \* EQUAL PAY ASKED

CAPETOWN — A call for equal salaries for black and white clergymen here was made in The Christian Leader, official monthly of the United Congregational Church of Southern Africa and the Presbyterian Church of South Africa. According to the monthly publication, the minimum salary for a native minister is 65 per cent of that paid to white clergymen.

### He Lives!

It seems that everyone started running that first Easter morning—running with an exciting message. Christ is alive and abroad in the world!

On that Good Friday when he was crucified, his loyal friends were brokenhearted. It was all over. They began to disperse. But two days later on a dew-drenched, sun-kissed morning, a woman went to the tomb. Amazingly, the stone was rolled back. She saw him and he spoke to her, then vanished. She was so excited that she ran at once to tell Peter and John, "He is alive!"

From then on everyone started running. Peter and John ran to the tomb. Peter was a stocky man, as tradition has it, and the fleet John outran him. Peter came puffing up and hurried into the tomb to find the body gone. They ran to tell the disciples the incredible news. "He lives!"

Two disciples were walking to the little village of Emmaus. Sad and forlorn, they were joined by a stranger whose amazing insights fascinated them.

Upon arrival at Emmaus they invited him to supper. At table, he became at once the central figure. Taking the nut-brown loaf in strong, sun-tanned hands, he broke it. Something in the familiar gesture caused them to know him. Then he vanished. Though the hour was late, they were so elated that they started running back to Jerusalem to tell the wondrous news, "He is alive!"

The good news is still the big news. Its promulgation on the earth requires excited people, so excited that they continue the running process of that first Easter. The time is short. We must spread the gospel widely and in depth and we must do it fast. No matter how bad things may look—he lives! So let's get going — really get going — and tell the good news to the world.
