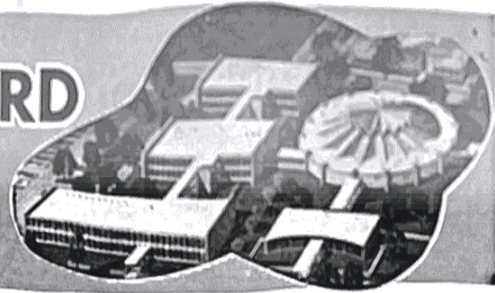

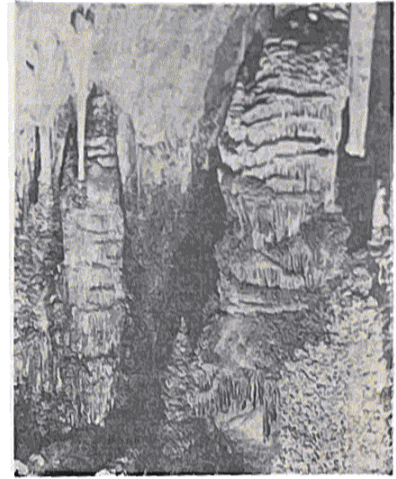

CARLSBAD CAVERNS

One of the most spectacular sights in the world is the Carlsbad Caverns in southern New Mexico. Like most caves, these caverns were formed by the effect of underground water on limestone rock. Over the centuries, the trickle of water carrying dissolved minerals from the ceilings of caves produces stalactites and stalagmites. Stalactites most often take on the appearance of stone icicles hanging from the ceiling. The stalagmites which build up from the cavern floors can take on a variety of shapes, as this photo of the Caverns' Hall of Giants attests.

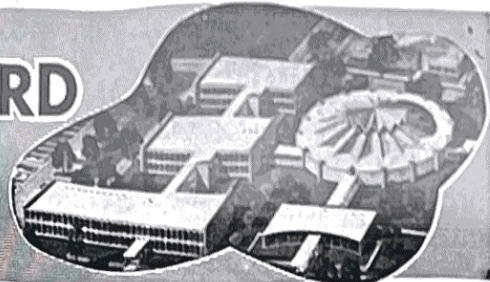

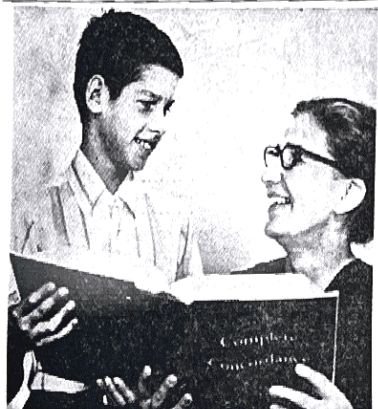

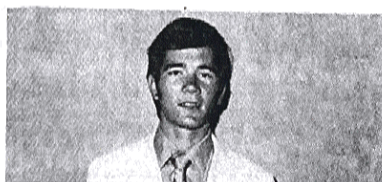
