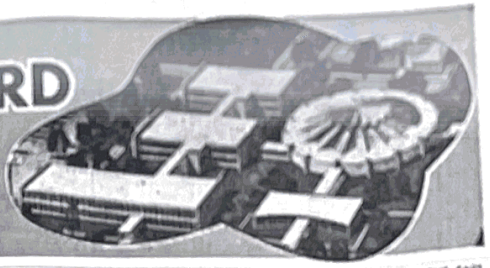

All of us are bound by the laws of nature, whether they be quite observable in their effects, like the law of gravity, or more subtle in their final fruition, like the laws of health. Rebel as we may, there is no special dispensation that allows a user of LSD, for instance, to safely jump out of a tenth-story building and not be subject to the law of gravity.

Bates, pastor of First Baptist Church here since 1959, yielded the presidential gavel in Philadelphia next month. He was elected president of the nation's largest Protestant denomination in Denver in 1970 and re-elected last June in St. Louis.

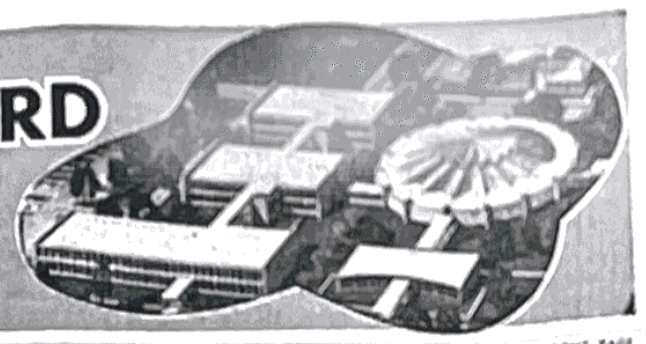
*** LWR AIRLIFTS MEDICINES**

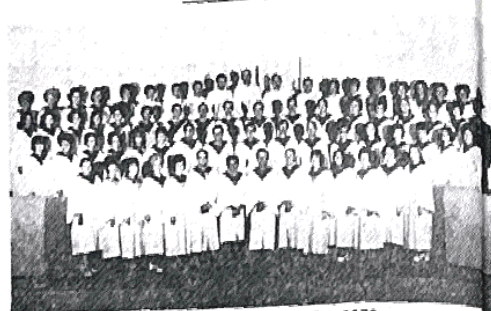
