We will have a Tour-Parents meeting Sunday night after church. We will discuss rules, itineraries etc. You must be present.

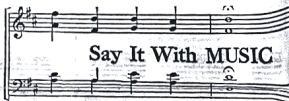

Do Your Own Thing

The modern statement of freedom and tolerance is "do your own thing." This seems to mean that no one need get caught in trying to live like others; do what others would like, or subscribe to any laws. It promises that freedom will be known by doing what one desires or values by his own standards, not by the standards of others.

Can you really do your own thing? Can you live in such freedom that you are really free? Are there hidden traps set to catch us when we try to do our own thing? How many smokers started out to do their own thing and would like now to be free? How many drug addicts and alcoholics got hooked by trying to be free?

The problem is that whenever we try to live with

self in the center of all our judgments and actions we soon end up not liking the self whom we express, and others don't like us either. Adam and Eve first heard that counsel, "Do your own thing; you can be as smart as God; you don't need His rules to live by." They tried it. And they soon hated it.

We suspect that often when "do your own thing" is advised someone is actually trying to get us to do his thing. The drug pushers have never shown any real interest in anyone else's personal freedom. The liquor trade isn't flourishing by promoting maturity.

The sad story of the book of Judges is about a nation of people attempting to live without civil law or divine law. They got into bondage again and again. God had to keep helping them.
