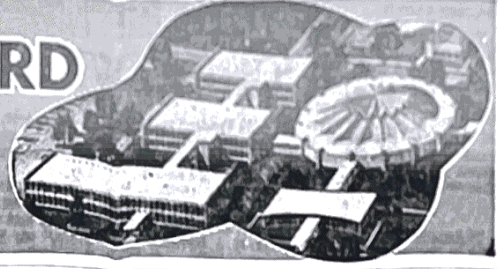

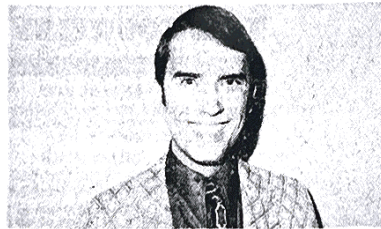

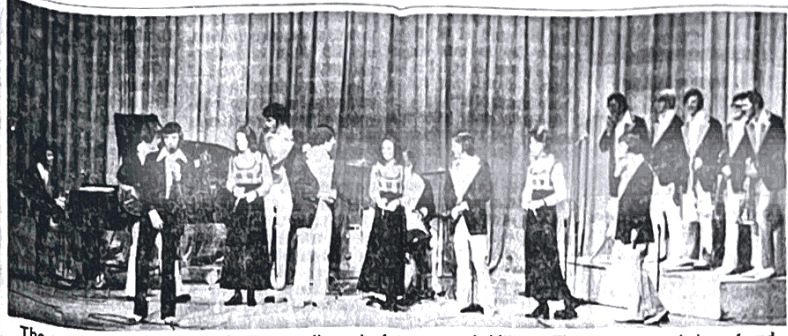

World Religious News Roundup

★ BOARD GETS GRANT
MINNEAPOLIS — The Board of College Education of the American Lutheran Church received a grant of \$16,500 from the Aid Association for Lutherans, a fraternal insurance company based in Appleton, Wisconsin. Purpose of the grant is to help the American Lutheran Church conduct management analysis reviews of its colleges.

★ NEW CHILDREN'S PROGRAM BEGINS
BEVERLY, Ky. — A red and white van buzzing along mountain roads in southeastern Kentucky is the sign of a new dimension in the already multiphased program of United Methodism's Red Bird Mission. Carrying a trained visitor to serve young Appalachian families in their homes and eight education centers, the van symbolizes the start of Red Bird's early childhood development program.

★ BAPTISTS APPROVE ADMISSION
ATLANTA — Union Baptist Church, one of Atlanta's largest black congregations, plus Baptist Chapel, a small integrated mission on Atlanta's South Side, were welcomed into the fellowship of the Atlanta Baptist Association here.

★ METHODIST BISHOP PROTESTS
WASHINGTON — A protest against the extension of the military draft in South Vietnam was lodged here by United Methodist Bishop John Wesley Lord. The bishop is head of a new peace program within his denomination.

★ MURILLO'S 'NATIVITY' FEATURED
WELLINGTON, N.Z. — A seventeenth Century painting of the Nativity and a modern stained glass window are featured on Christmas stamps issued this year by the New Zealand Post Office. The painting is "Virgin and Child" by the Spanish artist, Bartolome Murillo.
