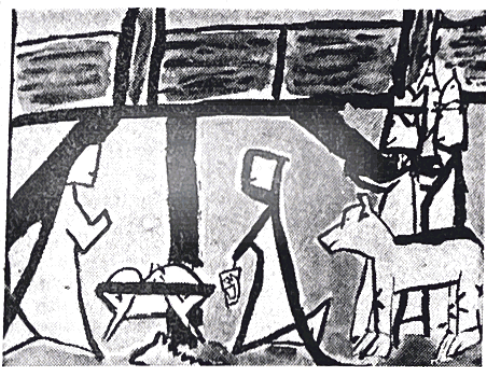

There's no church like this church near this church, so this must be the church. And I thank God for being your pastor. Come expecting God to do great and mighty things Sunday.

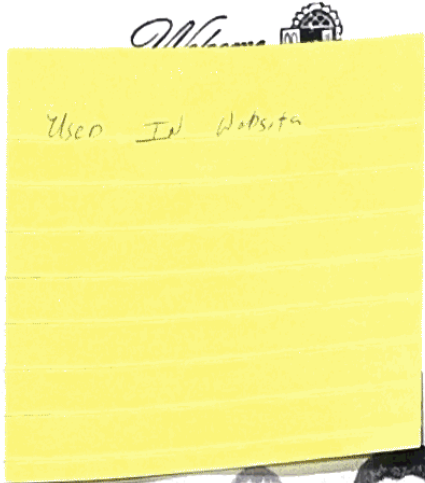

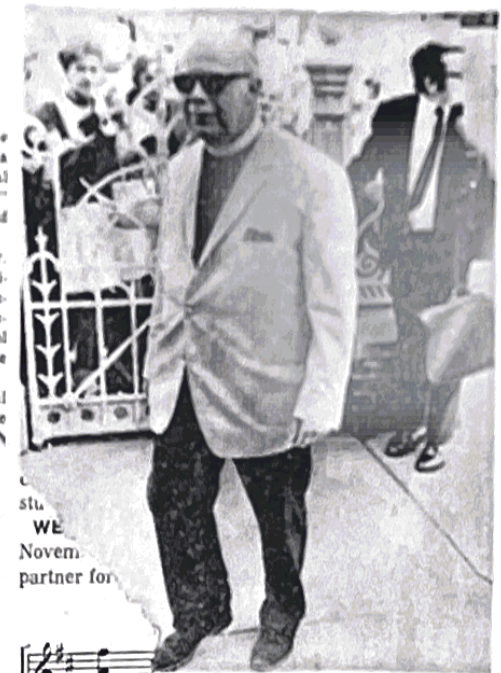

## Chrest Describes Anti-Semitism—Greatest Hatred in History'

ARCY, N.Y. (RNS) — An official of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops said that "anti-Semitism is the prototype of all prejudice" and is "the greatest hatred in human history." Father Edward H. Flannery, executive secretary of the Secretariat for Christian - Jewish Relations of the NCCB, told a conference on discrimination where that anti-Semitism has lasted some 23 centuries and is "very much alive today" — mostly in covert forms.

The International Workshop to Combat Racism and Discrimination was sponsored by the National Conference of Christians and Jews, the Canadian Council of Christians and Jews and the commissions for UNESCO in Canada and the U.S.

Father Flannery also asserted that the Jewish tie to Israel is still "completely misunderstood by most Christians." He predicted that anti-Semitism may outlast anti-black prejudice because anti-Semitism has been an "endemic factor in Christian history" and an "integral part of the Christian psyche."

"The difficulty of the problem today is that it has become almost totally unconscious," Father Flannery said. "Hence it is always denied. This makes it difficult to treat."
