

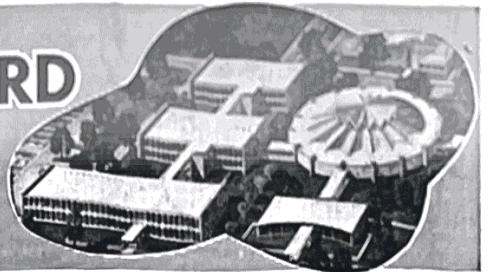

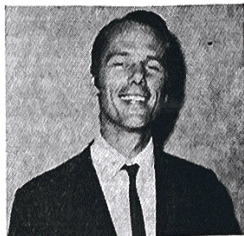

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. — A spokesman for the World Health Organization (WHO) said here that 11,000 cholera cases in various parts of the world have been reported during 1970 and that more than 1,000 persons have died of cholera this year. In 1969, the total of reported cases was estimated at 4,500.

* MERGE JOURNALS

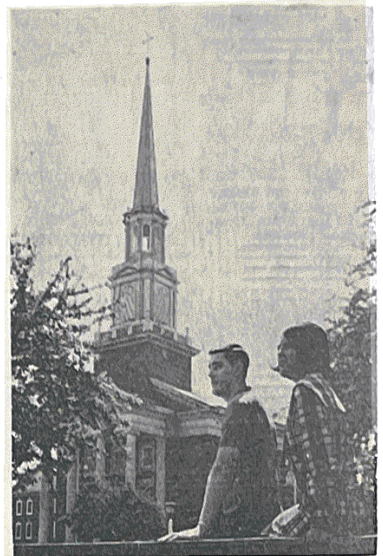
CAPETOWN — In an ecumenical experiment, two South African denominations are producing jointly a church newspaper.
