SOMETHING ELSE NEW!

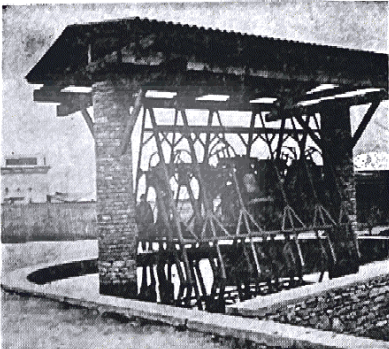
Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Graders — you are absolutely lucky! I want to tell you about your new schedule. It's fantastic!

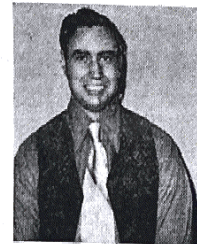
