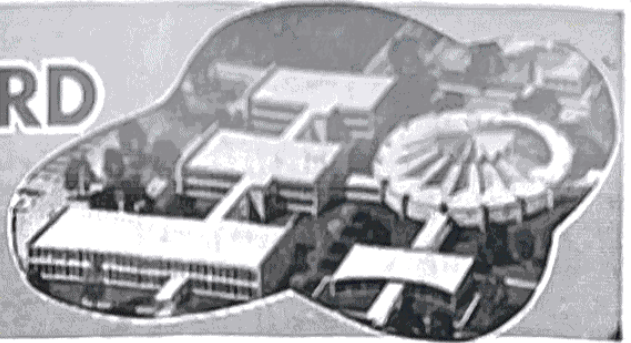

## CHRISTIAN LIFE REVIVAL NOVEMBER 2-8

**DEATH FOR LIFE**—In a village by a mission station lived two young men who were twins. One had given his life to Christ, but the other persisted in his evil ways. ### As I See It!

On November 3, 1970 Texans will vote on "liquor-by-the-drink." The vote will be on a constitutional amendment designed to open the door for liquor-by-the-drink legislation. The amendment will read:

FOR OR AGAINST REPEAL OF THE PROHIBITION AGAINST OPEN SALOONS FOUND IN SECTION XX, ARTICLE XVI OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF TEXAS.

Those who oppose liquor-by-the-drink must vote "Against". If the amendment fails to pass, then the constitutional barrier to liquor-by-the-drink will continue to act as a control on liquor sales in this state.

However, if the amendment were to pass then the next legislature would enact legislation that would legalize liquor-by-the-drink. Consider the following facts:

(1) Alcohol consumption in liquor-by-the-drink states is 60% higher than liquor by the bottle states. (ANNUAL STATISTICAL REVIEW — 1968).

(2) Outlets in liquor-by-the-drink states outnumber those in liquor by the bottle states by more than 5 to 1. The number of outlets in Texas from 1960 to 1968 decreased. In Iowa after approval of liquor-by-the-drink the number of outlets increased from 190 to 2,363 in one year.

(3) Alcohol is recognized by more authorities as a primary contributing influence in crime especially crimes of violence. Some specific cases studied and the percentages that showed 0.10% or above alcoholic concentration were: rape, 45%; felonious assault, 43%; murder, 67%; shooting, 79%; robbery, 60%. (JOURNAL OF CRIMINAL LAW, CRIMINOLOGY, AND POLITICAL SCIENCE).

(4) Detailed studies by coroners in 14 areas of the nation resulted in the discovery that 61% of the fatally injured drivers who came to their morgues had been drinking. (DALLAS MORNING NEWS).

(5) Governor Preston Smith stated that "In more than 50% of all divorce cases, excessive use of alcohol is a major causitive factor."

(6) Approximately 50% of all police man hours

are spent dealing with public drunkenness and other alcohol related minor offenses. More specifically, the city of Atlanta spent almost \$900,000.00 in 1961 for arresting, trying, and incarcerating the publically intoxicated. (PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT).

(7) In a study of prisoners in one state 43% were diagnosed as alcoholics. Wardens in some state penal institutions declare that 80% of their inmates point to misuse of beverage alcohol as a factor in their problems with the law. (SENATE SUB-COMMITTEE ON ALCOHOL AND NARCOTICS).

THE VOTE ON NOVEMBER 3 IS CRUCIAL. CERTAINLY THE PROBLEMS OF OUR SOCIETY ARE CRITICAL ENOUGH WITHOUT ADDITIONAL BURDENS. VOTE WITH ME AGAINST LIQUOR-BY-THE-DRINK.
