

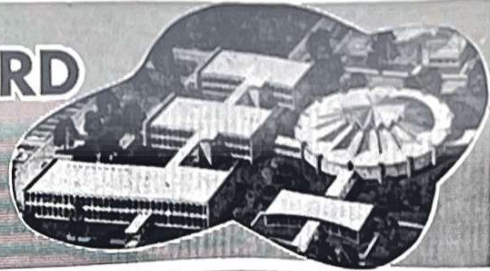

PASTOR-BADRY REVIVAL BEGINS SUNDAY

CHRISTIAN POLLEN—Susan Glaspell, in her story, "Pollen," tells of Ira Mead, a man who lived entirely shut up within his own little shell. All he cared about was his prize corn. One day, he discovered that his corn was being affected by the pollen which blew over the fence from his neighbor's field of corn. Ira quickly realized that something had to be done, if his corn were to remain of high quality. Several days later, he put some of his corn seed into a basket to take to his neighbor. When his mother asked him what he was going to do with the seed, he replied, "I'm going to take some corn seed to the Balch's to tell them what I know about raising corn. I can't have good corn while their corn's poor." Ira knew that, as long as his neighbor grew inferior corn, cross-pollination steadily would degrade the quality of his own corn. Therefore, he had to see that his neighbor planted only the best seed.
