MUSON NAMED OFFICER
SPRINGFIELD, Mo.—The Rev. Raymond Hudson has been named church lay officer in the newly-created Church Loan Department of the Assembly of God Division of Finance. For the past three years the Rev. Hudson has served as secretary of the stewardship department.

FLOOD RELIEF PROGRAMS STARTED
VALLEY FORGE.—The Pennsylvania Baptist Conference has developed a variety of programs to relieve churches and persons stricken by the recent floods. Relief supplies of food, clothing, supplies, furniture, and bedding, have been collected at centers throughout the state and have been distributed in Pennsylvania's Myerstown Valley and in Central Pennsylvania.

ASSEMBLY MAIL GROWTH
MINNEAPOLIS.—The Assembly of God, largest of the Pentecostal bodies, has hailed the charismatic or neo-Pentecostal movement developing in the older "mainline" churches. A report said that the Assembly of God "recognizes that no existing organization fully represents the body of Christ" and that they do not believe "risky of the Spirit" would come by all Christians allying themselves with one organization.

Here's the suggestion: What version of the scriptures do you bring to the service? As you hear, the Pastor preaches from the King James Version, often stressing particular words. I suggest, therefore, that you bring a KJV to the service. You will be able to follow the Pastor's track more easily.
(By the way, the LIVING BIBLE is more than a translation (word for word from the original language). It is a paraphrase or Ken Taylor's OWN language of the thoughts he understands from the original language. You can see that the LIVING BIBLE is more like a commentary than a translation. Remember that the LIVING BIBLE is wonderful for devotional reading but not as good as some others for study.)

An Aggressive Evangelistic Campaign

An aggressive evangelistic campaign, more broadly based than any in history, is planned by Christ Church in the United States. The campaign—Key II—will be launched late this year and run through 1973.
